

Privacy policy

We are bound by the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (**Privacy Act**) and the Australian Privacy Principles (**APPs**). This policy explains how and why we collect, use, hold and disclose your personal information.

"We", "us" and "our" means BMP Plus Pty Ltd, ACN 642 176 318 and Biofouling Solutions Pty Ltd ACN 134 732 193 of 244 Summerleas Road, Kingston, TAS 7050..

You consent to us collecting, holding, using and disclosing your personal information in accordance with this policy. If you do not agree with the policy and practices regarding your personal information and how it will be used do not download, install, register or use the Software, Services or Website.

This policy describes:

- (a) the types of information we may collect or that you may provide when you download, install, register with, access and/or use the BMP + Platform software (the **Software**) that We make available to you for download to access the related online software subscription service (the **Service**) including through any online portal pursuant to a licence and subscription agreement between us and you, or your employer, and/or
- (b) when you register with, access and/or use or visit our website (the **Website**).

and our practices for collecting, using, maintaining, protecting and disclosing that information.

This Policy applies only to information we collect in the Software, Service and/or Website and in email, text, and other electronic communications between us in connection with the Software, Service and/or Website.

This Policy DOES NOT apply to information that:

- (a) We collect offline or on or through any other Company apps or websites, including websites you may access through the Software, Service and/or the Website.
- (b) You provide to or is collected by any third party. For more information, see **How do we collect your personal information?** section below.

Our other websites and apps and these third parties may have their own privacy policies, which we encourage you to read before providing information on or through them.

What is personal information?

Personal information is any information or an opinion about an identified individual or an individual who can be reasonably identified from the information or opinion. Information or an opinion may be personal information regardless of whether it is true.

What personal information do we collect and hold?

We collect information about you and your interactions with us, for example:

- (c) when you download, install, purchase, access or use any of our Software or Services,
- (d) call us; or
- (e) otherwise visit our Website.

The information we collect from you may include:

- (a) your identity and contact details, employer name, title, employee identification number, email address, postal address, telephone number;
- (b) any other information that you provide by filling in forms in the Software, Services and/or the Website. This includes information provided at the time of downloading, installing, registering with, accessing and/or using the Software, Services and/or the Website; and
- (c) when you report a problem with the Software, Service and/or the Website; and
- (d) use of our Software and Services and details of enquiries or complaints you make;
- (e) information regarding your use of the Service, including biofouling management plans;
- (f) records and copies of your correspondence (including email addresses and phone numbers), if you contact us;
- (g) your search queries on the Software, Services and/or the Website;
- (h) your responses to surveys that we might ask you to complete for research or product development/enhancement purposes, or in connection with the Software or Service;
- (i) details of transactions you carry out through the Software, Services and/or the Website.

We may collect information about how you access, use and interact with the Website. We do this by using a range of tools such as Google Analytics. This information may include:

- (a) the location from which you have come to the site and the pages you have visited; and
- (b) technical data, which may include IP address, the types of devices you are using to access the website, device attributes, browser type, language and operating system.

We use cookies on the Website. A cookie is a small text file that the website may place on your device to store information. We may use persistent cookies (which remain on your computer even after you close your browser) to store information that may speed up your use of our website for any of your future visits to the website. We may also use session cookies (which no longer remain after you end your browsing session) to help manage the display and presentation of information on the website. You may refuse to use cookies by selecting the appropriate settings on your browser. However, please note that if you do this, you may not be able to use the full functionality of the website.

Automatic Information Collecting and Tracking

When you download, install, register with, access and/or use the Software and/or the Service, they may use technology to automatically collect:

Usage Details. When you access and use the Software and/or the Services, we may automatically collect certain details of your access to and use of the Software and/or the Services, including network traffic data, location of data, date and time data, usage data, logs and other communication data and the resources that you access and use on or through the Software, Services and/or the Website.

Device Information. We may collect information about your computing device, mobile device and internet connection, including the device's unique device identifier, IP address, operating system, browser type, mobile network information and the mobile device's telephone number.

Stored Information and Files. The Software, Services and/or the Website also may access

metadata and other information associated with other files stored on your device. This may include, for example, photographs, audio and video clips, personal contacts and address book information.

Location Information. Software and/or the Services collects real-time information about the location of your computing or mobile device, including the GPS coordinates and date and time.

Operational Data. The Software and/or the Services collects operational and usage information, data and other content generated by using the Software or Services.

If you do not want us to collect this information do not download, install, register with, access and/or use the Software, Services or the Website or delete it from your device.

Why do we collect, hold and use your personal information?

We collect, hold and use your personal information so that we can:

- (a) provide you with our Software and Services, information on our Software and Services, and manage our relationship with you;
- (b) contact you, for example, to respond to your queries or complaints, or if we need to tell you something important;
- (c) comply with our legal obligations and assist government and law enforcement agencies or regulators; or
- (d) identify and tell you about other products or services that we think may be of interest to you.

If you do not provide us with your personal information, we may not be able to provide you with our Software or Services, communicate with you or respond to your enquiries.

How do we collect your personal information?

We will collect your personal information directly from you whenever you interact with us.

We may collect information from third parties such as:

- (a) from your employer in accordance with our licence and subscription agreement;
- (b) other third party organisations involved in or associated with the Software or Services.

How do we store and hold personal information?

We store most information about you in computer systems and databases operated by either us or our external service providers. Some information about you is recorded in paper files that we store securely.

We implement and maintain processes and security measures to protect personal information which we hold from misuse, interference or loss, and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure.

These processes and systems include:

- (a) the use of identity and access management technologies to control access to systems on which information is processed and stored;
- (b) requiring all employees to comply with internal information security policies and keep information secure;

- (c) requiring all employees to complete training about information security; and
- (d) monitoring and regularly reviewing our practise against our own policies and against industry best practice.

We will also take reasonable steps to destroy or de-identify personal information once we no longer require it for the purposes for which it was collected or for any secondary purpose permitted under the APPs.

Who do we disclose your personal information to, and why?

We may transfer or disclose your personal information to our related companies.

We may disclose personal information to external service providers so that they may perform services for us or on our behalf.

We may also disclose your personal information to others outside our group of companies where:

- (a) we are required or authorised by law to do so;
- (b) you may have expressly consented to the disclosure or the consent may be reasonably inferred from the circumstances; or
- (c) we are otherwise permitted to disclose the information under the Privacy Act.

If the ownership or control of all or part of our business changes, we may transfer your personal information to the new owner.

Do we disclose personal information to overseas recipients?

We may disclose your personal information to recipients which are located outside Australia.

Do we use your personal information for marketing?

We will use your personal information to offer you additional products and services we believe may interest you, but we will not do so if you tell us not to. These products and services may be offered by us, our related companies, our other business partners or our service providers.

Where you receive electronic marketing communications from us, you may opt out of receiving further marketing communications by following the opt-out instructions provided in the communication.

Access to and correction of your personal information

You may access or request correction of the personal information that we hold about you by contacting us. Our contact details are set out below. There are some circumstances in which we are not required to give you access to your personal information.

There is no charge for requesting access to your personal information, but we may require you to meet our reasonable costs in providing you with access (such as photocopying costs or costs for time spent on collating large amounts of material).

We will respond to your requests to access or correct personal information in a reasonable time and will take all reasonable steps to ensure that the personal information we hold about you remains accurate, up to date and correct.

Your rights under the EU GDPR

Under the European Union (EU) General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), as a data subject you have the right to:

- (a) access your data;
- (b) have your data deleted or corrected where it is inaccurate;
- (c) object to your data being processed and to restrict processing;
- (d) withdraw consent to having your data processed;
- (e) have your data provided in a standard format so that it can be transferred elsewhere; and
- (f) not be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing.

(collectively **Data Subject Rights**)

We have processes in place to deal with Data Subject Rights requests. Our actions and responsibilities will depend on whether we are the controller or processor of the personal data at issue. Depending on our role as either a controller or processor, the process for enabling Data Subject Rights may differ, and are always subject to applicable law. Please refer to the Contact Details section of this policy if you would like to make a Data Subject Rights request.

Complaints

If you have a complaint about the way in which we have handled any privacy issue, including your request for access or correction of your personal information, you should contact us. Our contact details are set out below.

We will consider your complaint and determine whether it requires further investigation. We will notify you of the outcome of this investigation and any subsequent internal investigation.

If you remain unsatisfied with the way in which we have handled a privacy issue, you may approach an independent advisor or contact the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (www.oaic.gov.au) for guidance on alternative courses of action which may be available.
